



## **Caring Community Foundation Announces First Two Corporate Supporters**

Our community fund helps cover operations, grants, and helps us respond quickly and effectively to current and future community needs.”

Susie Kufahl, CCF Director, commented, “The Expedition Campaign seeks community partners who share our commitment and have the means to join us in this vital campaign. The community fund is endowed so it will always exist, working to produce income to fund charitable causes and non-profits in the area in and around Pottawatomie County.”
