### Stepping Up: Permanent Fund for Our Communities

When the Caring Community Foundation (CCF) was just an idea over five years ago, Jim Moore enthusiastically said "yes" to being on the Board of Directors and working to get it started. Since that time, he has continued to serve on the Board, currently as treasurer, and watched as the foundation has grown and benefitted the participating small towns and non-profit entities in Northeast Kansas.

Both Jim and Jenni, his wife, are small town people. Jim grew up in Westmoreland. Jenni grew up on a ranch outside Olsburg. Coming from families that valued giving back, they have continued to try to practice those beliefs. They practice the idea that when they have enough, they share. This includes giving to many projects, including church, children's charities, international food missions. Locally, at this time in their lives, Jenni volunteers with the local historical society and senior healthcare while Jim focuses on education and building a sustainable future for local communities through his career in banking.

The CCF has provided additional opportunities to give back, this time in funds that will be endowed to remain to help others way past their lifetimes. To that end, they have established a renewable scholarship for two nursing students annually in Jenni's name. But even bigger than that, Jim and Jenni contribute to the CCF permanent fund. Money gifted here funds current needs with the flexibility essential for changing community issues. The CCF has very little overhead, including no paid employees, so this allows the CCF to help sponsor fund raising activities and local grants given to applicant organizations in our communities. Small, regular donations add up and Jim and Jenni continue to practice that principle in gifting to accounts through the Caring Community Foundation.
